

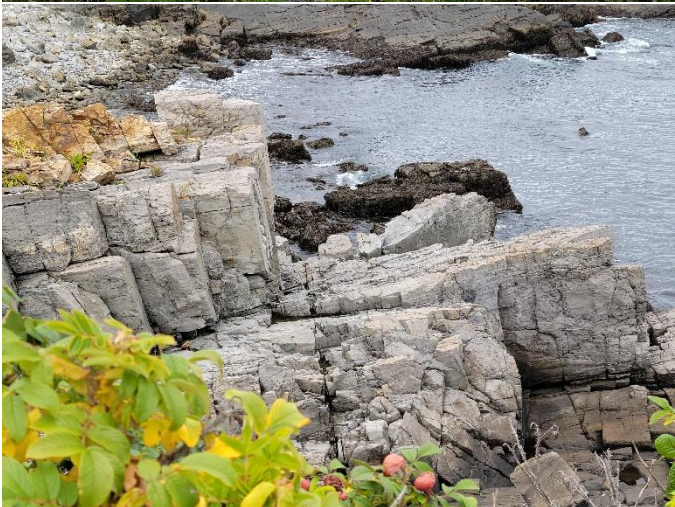
## September 20 – Saco, ME
